<sup>2</sup> “We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, <sup>3</sup> remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ,” (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3 ESV). Therefore, just as St. Paul gives thanks to God for the “work of faith and labor of love” found in the Thessalonians, I give thanks to God for each of you as members and friends of Ascension. All of you bring gifts to the ministry and mission of God in this place, and I have a deep sense of gratitude for the sacrifices you make. For security purposes, there will be a new intercom system installed at the office door. The exterior glass door to the conference room and office will be covered with a solid film that blocks visitors from looking in. A two-way intercom with camera will be mounted on the porch. Intercom screens installed inside the door and in the office will allow us to see and speak to visitors similar to a Ring doorbell. In the future, this system allows for a door opening mechanism to be added for remote unlocking.

The red van needs a replacement fuel tank due to vandalism in the past year. After the repair is complete, we will store the van offsite to protect it from further damage.
