Grace and peace to you,

⁵ For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶ For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace,” (Romans 8:5-6 ESV).

It is fascinating to watch the world change, along with the beliefs of people. Biblical literacy, or knowing the basics of Scripture, is lower each passing year. Research indicates, “According to the 2014 ‘The State of the Bible’ report by Barna Group and American Bible Society, a majority of U.S. adults (81 percent) said they consider themselves highly, moderately or somewhat knowledgeable about the Bible. Yet less than half (43 percent) were able to name the first five books of the Bible.”¹ The inevitable result of knowing less and less of the Word of Truth is a growing number of Christians who live according to the flesh and the world’s standards. Regarding the 5th Commandment (You shall not murder) alone, vastly differing opinions exist. The Word is not an opinion, and God tells us that innocent life is to be preserved. The flesh trusts in the flesh, and the flesh is mortal. In other words, we often place our trust in death instead of trusting God through His Spirit.

Can trusting in death be a solution? No. The story of God is all about victory over death and the grave along with generational life. Jesus healed many who were weak and dying, and never once did He claim that someone is better off dead. The Good News claims that God overcame death, and we can too by grace through faith. As we live according to the flesh, we naturally take our eyes off Jesus and trusting in Him. The offers of death to solve our problems are many: euthanasia, suicide, assisted suicide, abortion, and murder. The offer of life is found only one place, in God and His mysterious and wonderful plan of salvation. Trust in God alone, for in Him is forgiveness, life, and salvation!

Gracia y paz para ti,

⁵ Los que viven conforme a la naturaleza pecaminosa fijan la mente en los deseos de tal naturaleza; en cambio, los que viven conforme al Espíritu fijan la mente en los deseos del Espíritu. ⁶ La mentalidad pecaminosa es muerte, mientras que la mentalidad que proviene del Espíritu es vida y paz,” (Romanos 8:5-6).

Es fascinante ver el mundo cambiar, junto con las creencias de las personas. La alfabetización bíblica, o conocer los conceptos básicos de las Escrituras, es menor cada año que pasa. La investigación indica: “De acuerdo con el informe ‘El estado de la Biblia’ de 2014 de Barna Group y la Sociedad Bíblica Americana, la mayoría de los adultos estadounidenses (81 por ciento) dijeron que se consideran altamente, moderadamente o algo conocedores de la Biblia. Sin embargo, menos de la mitad (43 por ciento) fueron capaces de nombrar los primeros cinco libros de la Biblia.”¹ El resultado inevitable de conocer cada vez menos de la Palabra de Verdad es un número creciente de cristianos que viven de acuerdo con la carne y las normas del mundo. Con respecto al 5^o Mandamiento (No matarás) solo, existen opiniones muy diferentes. La Palabra no es una opinión, y Dios nos dice que la vida inocente debe ser preservada. La carne confía en la carne, y la carne es mortal. En otras palabras, a menudo ponemos nuestra confianza en la muerte en lugar de confiar en Dios a través de Su Espíritu.

¿Confiar en la muerte puede ser una solución? No. La historia de Dios tiene que ver con la victoria sobre la muerte y la tumba junto con la vida generacional. Jesús sanó a muchos que estaban débiles y moribundos, y ni una sola vez afirmó que alguien está mejor muerto. Las Buenas Nuevas afirman que Dios venció a la muerte, y nosotros también podemos por gracia a través de la fe. A medida que vivimos de acuerdo con la carne, naturalmente quitamos nuestros ojos de Jesús y confiamos en Él. Las ofertas de muerte para resolver nuestros problemas son muchas: eutanasia, suicidio, suicidio asistido, aborto y asesinato. La oferta de vida se encuentra en un solo lugar, en Dios y en su misterioso y maravilloso plan de salvación. ¡Confía solo en Dios, porque en Él está el perdón, la vida y la salvación!

We also collected items for Snow Cap, Sunshine Division Toy and Joy, and New Avenues for Youth through our Thrivent Action Team card.





The Ceremony of the Offertory

LCMS Stewardship Ministry Newsletter Article – July-August 2022

Have you ever noticed the subtle ceremony involved in receiving the offerings during the Divine Service? After all the offerings have been collected, they are brought forward and given to the pastor or one of his assistants. The pastor then turns toward the altar, and as he slightly bows his head, the collection plates with the offerings in them are raised slightly to the Lord and then placed either on the altar or a table for the offerings. Why do we do have this ceremony? And what does it teach us? For that is what ceremony does; it teaches, as the Augsburg Confession tells us, what we need to know about Christ (AC XXIV, 1–3).

Originally, this ceremony included more than simply bringing forward what was collected in the offering plates. The elements for the Holy Communion—the bread and the wine—were brought forward along with the offering plates. As the offering plates and the elements were lifted toward the Lord, and placed upon the altar, the elements would be put in the center and the altar, now made a table, would be set for the Lord's Supper.

These gifts brought to the altar came from the sweat of the people's brow. It is the bread and wine, the fruits of the peoples' labor in this fallen world. After six days of labor and toil, the people would bring a generous proportion for the Lord's work. It was set upon the altar and offered to the Lord for Him to take up and press into His service for His gracious work in and among them.

For what they offered to the Lord from the sweat of their brow, the bread of anxious toil, came back to them as the bread of life, the bread come down from heaven that whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup would receive life through the forgiveness of their sins.

This is not unlike what the Lord did for His people in the Old Testament:

You shall tithe all the yield of your seed that comes from the field year by year. And before the Lord your God, in the place that he will choose, to make his name dwell there, you shall eat the tithe of your grain, of your wine, and of your oil, and the firstborn of your herd and flock, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always. And if the way is too long for you, so that you are not able to carry the tithe, when the Lord your God blesses you, because the place is too far from you, which the Lord your God chooses, to set his name there, then you shall turn it into money and bind up the money in your hand and go to the place that the Lord your God chooses and spend the money for whatever you desire—oxen or sheep or wine or strong drink, whatever your appetite craves. And you shall eat there before the Lord your God and rejoice, you and your household.

What a blessing! God provides for us in all things. He provides bread from the sweat of our brows, and He receives this from us in the first fruits offerings we give to Him in thanksgiving and praise. He receives and turns it into spiritual bread, heavenly bread, the bread of eternal life and gives it back to us so that we might have joy. So, the next time you are in the Divine Service, watch this ceremony in wonder, that the Lord gives back to us, what we have given to Him so that we may rejoice in the salvation He has won upon the cross and gives to us in His supper.


