THE DAY OF PENTECOST – CONFIRMATION

Welcome to all who are attending our service today. We are glad you are with us! To all guests and visitors, we especially extend our hands of friendship. May God bless the worship time for each one of you. Please come again!

NURSERY AVAILABLE We have an unstaffed nursery for your convenience and privacy. The nursery has audio and video so you may hear and see the worship service while attending to your child.

Holy Communion is celebrated at the 8:30 service on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, and at the 11:00 service on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

For those wishing to commune at the Lords Table with us today:

The Lutheran practice of close Communion attempts to prevent a person from eating and drinking judgment on himself (1 Corinthians 11:23–30). Thus, attendance at the Lords Supper implies a four-level commitment to Christ. We believe that communicants must: (1) be baptized Christians; (2) accept the real presence of Christs body in the bread and His blood in the wine; (3) confess and repent of ones sins and trust that God offers complete forgiveness of those sins in this Sacrament; and (4) share oneness of faith, doctrine and practice among those who commune. Those wishing to commune with us today who have not done so previously, please see the pastor or an elder before the service begins. (*Grape juice is available for those who do not drink alcohol, and gluten-free wafers are available upon request.*)

Theme: “Restoration through the Spirit”

As We Gather: The Day of Pentecost is more connected to Easter than to the Sundays after Pentecost. It is the fiftieth day of Easter, marking the new dawn under the guidance of the Spirit. The Lord works through the preached Gospel and our life together as the baptized around His Table to deliver what He has promised. Thus the ministry of the Spirit is not some ethereal reality experienced in our feelings but the concrete reality of the Word spoken into our ears to bring forth faith and the body and blood of Jesus received by faith in Holy Communion. This is the way the Spirit continues to work in us and for us and we continue to receive His ministry by faith and to celebrate this with great joy.

The Third Article of the Apostles' Creed and Explanation

P As we celebrate the Lord pouring out the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, we join in confessing the words of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed, as well as its explanation from Luther's Small Catechism.

C **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

P What does this mean?

C **I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.**

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

✠ THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION ✠

P These young Christians, presenting themselves for the Rite of Confirmation, have been instructed in the Word of God: the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, Holy Baptism, Confession, and the Lord's Supper. They know that God has given them forgiveness of sins in Holy Baptism, and they also know what God desires of His followers. As baptized children of God and members of the body of Christ, they are prepared to confess, as their own, the Christian faith and take their place as communicant members in the fellowship of believers. They now express their faith in the Triune God by answering these questions:

P Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

R **YES, I believe in God, the Father Almighty.**

P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?

R **YES, I believe in Jesus Christ His only Son.**

P Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

R **YES, I believe in the Holy Spirit.**

P Do you believe and accept that the entire Bible, both Old Testament and New Testament, is the inspired Word of God?

R **I DO.**

P Do you confess and accept the doctrine of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod as taken from the Bible as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism to be faithful and true?

R **I DO.**

P Do you intend to faithfully continue in this confession and Church, and would you give up all, even your very life, rather than fall away from your Lord?

R **YES, with the help of God.**

P Do you believe that in Holy Baptism God has accepted you as His own?

R **I do believe.**

P Do you desire to share in the Lord's Supper with us because in it Christ Jesus comes to you, forgives your sins, and strengthens you to trust Him and to love one another?

R **I do desire the Lord's Supper.**

P You are about to be admitted into the communing membership of this congregation. God and we invite you to come regularly and frequently to corporate worship in God's house. God and we desire you to continue your study in God's Word so that you may better understand and live the Christian faith. You will want to come to the Lord's Supper often realizing what God has promised to give you in this sacrament.

All this will help you to live as God desires His people to live.

Therefore, I ask you: Do you promise to commit to regular and frequent worship, Bible study, and Holy Communion attendance, knowing that God will help you?

R **I do promise with the help of God.**

P Do you desire to be a communicant member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and Ascension Lutheran Congregation?

R **I do so desire.**

THE SOLEMN VOW OF THE PARENTS

(Parents rise)

P Your children, who have made these promises, need your continued guidance and support. Therefore, I ask you: Will you continue to guide and direct, support and encourage your child in word, in deed, and in example?

R **YES, with the help of God.**

THE SOLEMN VOW OF THE CONGREGATION

(All worshipers rise)

P The promises made by these Confirmands and parents are difficult to fulfill. They need God's help and our encouragement and prayers. Do you this day give your promise before God to these Christians, to help them fulfill their promises to the Lord?

C **WE DO, with the help of God.**

THE BLESSING OF THE CONFIRMANDS
