Mientras Wyatt (que está estudiando para el seminario) revisaba algunos libros antiguos en la oficina de repuesto, encontró un libro que contenía un certificado que pertenecía a mi esposa Michele. Era un certificado de la escuela secundaria que indicaba que ella había obtenido una letra en gimnasia. Ella había donado el libro al ministerio juvenil y familiar, pero no se dio cuenta de que un recuerdo del pasado estaba guardado dentro.

Leí un artículo acerca de los muchos objetos encontrados dentro de libros usados para la reventa. Algunos de los artículos incluyen cuarenta billetes de \$1000, una tarjeta de béisbol de novato de Mickey Mantle, un certificado de matrimonio de 1879, un anillo de diamantes, tarjetas de seguro social, un cuaderno de racionamiento de los Estados Unidos de la Segunda Guerra Mundial (con sellos aún incluidos), un par de tijeras y una licencia de conducir, por nombrar algunos. Adam Tobin, dueño de Unnameable Books en Brooklyn, Nueva York, ha creado una exhibición dentro de su librería dedicada a objetos descubiertos en libros. El objeto más valioso descubierto por Adam es una carta escrita por C. S. Lewis, autor de la serie de Narnia. Tobin dijo: “Es una mezcla variada. Hemos estado haciendo esto durante aproximadamente dos años desde que abrimos la tienda. La exhibición rápidamente ocupó toda la pared trasera y ahora se está extendiendo a otros lugares, y hay una acumulación de cosas que aún no hemos puesto en exhibición.”¹ Con todos los tesoros y objetos misteriosos que se han encontrado en estos libros, (Continúa en la página 4)

“¹ Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; ² but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on His law he meditates day and night. ³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers,” (Psalm 1:1-3 ESV).

As Wyatt (studying for seminary) was going through some old books in the spare office, he came across a book that contained a certificate that belonged to my wife Michele. It was a certificate from high school stating she lettered in gymnastics. She donated the book to the youth and family ministry but didn’t realize a relic from the past was tucked inside. I read an article about the many objects found inside used books for resale. Some of the items include forty \$1000 bills, a Mickey Mantle rookie baseball card, a marriage certificate from 1879, a diamond ring, social security cards, a World War II U.S. ration book (with stamps remaining), a pair of scissors, and a driver’s license to name a few. Adam Tobin, owner of Unnameable Books in Brooklyn, New York, has created a display inside his bookstore dedicated to objects discovered in books. The most valuable item discovered by Adam is a letter written by CS Lewis, author of the Narnia series. Tobin said, “It’s a motley assortment. We’ve been doing it for about two years since opening the store. The display quickly took over the back wall and now it’s spreading to other places, and there’s a backlog of stuff that we haven’t put up yet.”¹ With all the treasures and mystery objects that have been found in these books, nothing compares to what can be discovered in God’s Word. Within the Bible a person can find forgiveness, hope, purpose for living, peace, heaven, and eternal riches.

As I commend the Word of God to you for reading and devotion, I am 100 percent convinced that it will do what God intends in your life. More than that, in time, God’s Word will become a priceless treasure to you that far outweighs anything in this transient world. In a world that considers prosperity to include wealth, fame, and power, there is no better way to

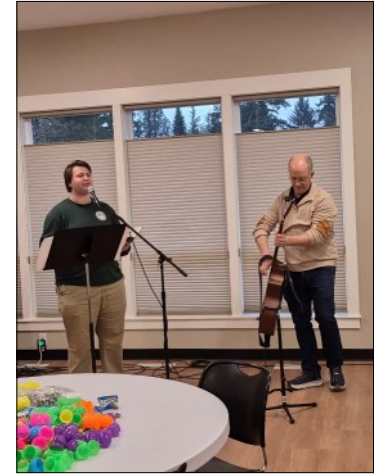

The highlight was visiting Beautiful Saviour on March 18 to listen to the choir from Trinity Lutheran High School in Bend. It was a wonderful night of song and we were all blessed by it.



PROPERTY MANAGEMENT REPORT

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Spring Clean Up on Saturday, March 21! Lots of work – both inside and outside – was done by about 15 people. Some, who were unable to make it on Saturday, participated on their own on different days. Among the chores that were completed was cleaning of the pews and wood work in the Sanctuary as well as dusting and cobweb removal throughout the sanctuary, narthex and hallways. Outside, the sidewalk leading to the main entrance was pressure washed, landscaping refreshed and a dump trailer of yard debris was hauled off to recycling. Bulbs that were planted last fall have popped up and are blooming. For those of you who missed this fun and excitement, another work party is coming soon!

On March 4, United Fire and Safety was on site to perform our 5-year mandatory inspection of our fire sprinkler system. They didn't get very far into their testing when the sewer backed up into the basement. Fortunately, the technician noticed it right away (it's amazing how fortunate we have a sense of smell) and stopped the testing. Our contractor, McCord Construction was on scene within 30 minutes to assess the situation. It was determined that the sewer line was plugged and Drain Pro was called. They worked with their camera, snake, and jetter to unclog 2 places where debris had built up in our lines. One spot was under the basement and the other place was under the south parking lot. The clogs were a result of old, narrowing pipes and debris that should not have been there (diapers, wipes, balloon pieces, etc.).

United Fire was back out on March 18 and were able to complete the mandatory 5-year inspection. Everything passed muster; however, 4 sprinkler heads were removed and taken for testing. If any of them fail their test, we will have to replace a majority of the sprinkler heads. The cost for this inspection was \$2,557.35. If we need to replace any sprinkler heads, additional costs will incur.

We have received 14 additional water sensors that will be able to warn us of unwanted water intrusion before it can become something major. These will be placed in areas that could potentially be prone to a pipe or valve failing so that we can have as much notice as possible in order to mitigate major damage.

Filters to all six HVAC units were changed.

Sorting and purging are being done in the basement. There is lots of stuff that was accumulated by the daycare and preschool and much of it is outdated and/or broken. Items are being sorted into keep, sell, give away, recycle and throw away piles.

We are almost done with the installation of the sound panels in the Community room and they already seem to be making a difference. Can you hear me now?!?

We are in the process of getting quotes for new flooring in the Narthex, Nursery, two hallways and both bathrooms in the east hallway. However, before the new flooring is installed, we should paint the walls and freshen up the wood work while we still have the old flooring down. Stay tuned!!
