THEME: “WRAPPED PRESENTS”

AS WE GATHER: This Advent, we prepared for our Christmas celebration by considering various ways our seasonal decorations amplify the real meaning of Christmas. Though many of the reasons behind holiday decorations go unappreciated and even unnoticed, they still point us to Christ. Some of the decorations do this in a more obvious way. Even the most secular of souls sees baby Jesus in the crèche. But even seemingly nonreligious signs of the season like evergreens and lights originated in Christendom. Now, as we have come to the Twelve Days of Christmas, we consider another Christian tradition: the exchange of Christmas presents. The giving of gifts, beautifully wrapped, reflects the gracious love of our heavenly Father, the “Father of lights,” from whom “every good gift and every perfect gift” comes (James 1:17). Certainly, the greatest gift of all is none other than what we have come to celebrate: God’s self-offering to us through His Son for the forgiveness of our sin. CALL TO WORSHIP

P Brothers and sisters, we have gathered to celebrate the greatest gift of all, our blessed Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. O Come, let us worship Him!

C **Christ is born!**

P He is a child, and yet God. He is a babe, and yet the Lord. He is a man, and yet divine. Jesus never stopped being God, but He truly became one of us.

C **The Savior has come!**

P The white candle, the Christ candle, symbolizes our pure and spotless Savior, born of a virgin to save us from our sin. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.

C **Glory to God!**

CONFSSION AND ABSOLUTION

P On this evening, as we reflect on the greatest gift the world has ever received, it is good to remember why Jesus was sent. Because all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (*Romans 3:23*), we confess our need for the forgiveness God gives us through His Son.

P If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. (*1 John 1:8*)

C **But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.**
(*1 John 1:9*)

(Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.)

C **Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.**

P Hear the Good News on this most holy night. Jesus Christ, who was born for you and died for you, gives you this gift: the forgiveness of all your sins. Through His Word, you are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the  Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Everlasting Father, You brought us peace even as we rebelled against You. SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 7:10-14 (ESV)

¹⁰ Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz: ¹¹ “Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven.” ¹² But Ahaz said, “I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test.” ¹³ And he said, “Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel,” [which means, God with us.]

Titus 3:4-7 (ESV)

⁴ But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, ⁵ He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

SCRIPTURE**Matthew 1:18–23 (ESV)**

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins.” ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³ “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel” (which means, God with us).

¹ In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn Son and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths and laid Him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

+ CHRISTMAS BY CANDLELIGHT +

(The choir will exit the chancel and carry lit candles as they move into the center aisle. The congregation will then light their candles from these. Always keep lit candles in the upright position to keep wax from spilling. The unlit candle is tipped to be lit.)

P As the light of these candles illumine our faces, it symbolizes the light of Christ, a child in the manger at Bethlehem, a Savior suffering our death on the cross, and soon to come from His throne on high as Judge of all. He is our Light here on earth and the eternal Light who enlightens heaven, where there is no need of candle or sun. Rejoice, for the Light of the world has come, who transforms us with the brightness of His glory.
