Last week we gathered for Iron Men Fellowship, which meets on the fourth Saturday of each month at 8:00 a.m. in the Community Room. Our time usually begins with a short devotion that leads into discussion, and this time the topics sparked some great conversation. One question we considered was how to approach time in the Scriptures. Should we begin at Genesis 1:1 and read straight through? Spend more time in certain Gospels or books? Is it alright to simply open the Bible to any page and start reading? Do "Bible in a year" plans actually help?

If these are questions you've asked, thank God! It shows a desire to be in His Word. We all engage Scripture differently. Some listen to audio Bibles and absorb more that way. Others need a reading plan to stay focused. Some use apps on their phones or tablets. For many, certain translations are easier to follow and understand. Whatever the method, the important thing is that the Word of God is at work in you, shaping and transforming your life.

St. Peter urges us to "pay attention" to the Word, for it is a light shining in the darkness and God's own voice speaking to us. The Word is a means of grace – the way God delivers His grace to us. Again and again, Scripture reminds us of God's deep love shown through the death and resurrection of His Son, and that His promises never fail. With such blessings, it only makes sense to spend more time in the Word each day. It also makes sense to join a Bible study and grow alongside others who share the same journey.

Get serious. Get creative. Get in the Word.

¡Gracia y paz a vosotros de parte de Dios nuestro Padre y del Señor Jesucristo!

"19 Esto ha venido a confirmarnos la palabra de los profetas, a la cual ustedes hacen bien en prestar

atención, como a una lámpara que brilla en un lugar oscuro, hasta que despunte el día y salga el lucero de la mañana en sus corazones.²⁰ Ante todo, tengan muy presente que ninguna profecía de la Escritura surge de la interpretación particular de nadie.²¹ Porque la profecía no ha tenido su origen en la voluntad humana, sino que los profetas hablaron de parte de Dios, impulsados por el Espíritu Santo," (2 Pedro 1:19-21, NVI).

La semana pasada nos reunimos para la Fraternidad de Hombres de Hierro, que se lleva a cabo el cuarto sábado de cada mes a las 8:00 a. m. en el Salón Comunitario. Nuestro encuentro suele comenzar con una breve reflexión que da paso a la conversación, y esta vez los temas suscitaron un diálogo muy enriquecedor. Una pregunta que consideramos fue cómo abordar el tiempo con las Escrituras.

¿Deberíamos comenzar en Génesis 1:1 y leerlo de principio a fin? ¿Dedicar más tiempo a ciertos Evangelios o libros? ¿Está bien simplemente abrir la Biblia por cualquier página y empezar a leer?

¿Realmente funcionan los planes de "Leer la Biblia en un año"?

Si te has hecho estas preguntas, ¡gracias a Dios! Demuestra tu deseo de estar en Su Palabra. Todos nos relacionamos con las Escrituras de manera diferente. Algunos escuchan la Biblia en audio y así absorben más. Otros necesitan un plan de lectura para mantenerse enfocados. Algunos usan aplicaciones en sus teléfonos o tabletas. Para muchos, ciertas traducciones son más fáciles de seguir y comprender. Cualquiera que sea el método, lo importante es que la Palabra de Dios esté obrando en ti, moldeando y transformando tu vida.

San Pedro nos exhorta a prestar atención a la Palabra, pues es una luz que brilla en la oscuridad y la voz misma de Dios que nos habla. La Palabra es un medio de gracia: la forma en que Dios nos entrega su gracia. Una y otra vez, la Escritura nos recuerda el profundo amor de Dios manifestado a través de la muerte y resurrección de su Hijo, y que sus promesas nunca fallan. Con tales bendiciones, es lógico dedicar más tiempo a la Palabra cada día. También es lógico unirse a un estudio bíblico y crecer junto a otros que comparten el mismo camino.

Toma esto en serio. Sé creativo. Sumérgete en la Palabra.

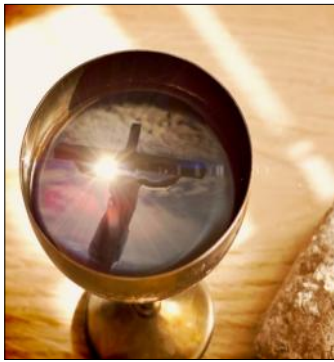

POINTING TO THE ROCK OF AGES

LCMS Stewardship Ministry – November 2025

Not the labor of my hands Can fulfill Thy Law's demands;

Could my zeal no respite know, Could my tears forever flow,

All for sin could not atone; Thou must save, and Thou alone. (LSB 761:2)

While the classic hymn "Rock of Ages" shows up in the Lutheran Service Book in the "Hope and Comfort" section, it can also teach us a valuable lesson about Christian stewardship. If that surprises you, stay with me on this one.

No Lutheran would ever dispute the fact that our work does not save us. Ephesians 2 makes it truly clear that we are dead in our trespasses and sins and would remain in that state until Christ raises us by grace. There is not a ladder on which we can climb out of the grave that our sins have dug for us. No blood, sweat nor tears will be able to rescue us. We all know this.

Our works do not save. Christ's work on the cross of Calvary does! He bore human flesh. He carried the burden of our sin to the cross. His body was beaten, bruised and bloodied for us. He has indeed atoned for us! This is more than enough reason for this hymn to be bouncing around in your head all day today!

But our work has a place. The place is in response to what the Father has done for us in Jesus. The

Rock of Ages, who is Jesus, becomes the foundation on which our lives of faith are built. The Holy Spirit uses the means of grace to make us God's workmanship that Paul talks about in Ephesians 2:10.

Our workmanship does not display our power or prowess. Like the heavens declare the handiwork of the Creator, the works of a redeemed sinner point others to the salvation that is worked only by Jesus alone. Our work is a response to and reflection of a grace and glory that we ourselves could never accomplish or achieve.

We become stewards of the treasure that is the Gospel. When we faithfully support the work of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with our financial support, we are doing the work which points to the One who alone atones. When we come alongside a struggling sister or brother for whom Christ died and we share the stewardship work of compassion and care, we enfold the treasure of God's love and redemption. When we make it a weekly priority to arrange our schedule to be in the Lord's House with other stewards of the Gospel to receive again and again the Gospel's precious gift, we are stewards of the Body of Christ in the congregation that points even more people to Jesus.

We cannot do this. Jesus does it through us. We are simply stewards of this precious treasure!

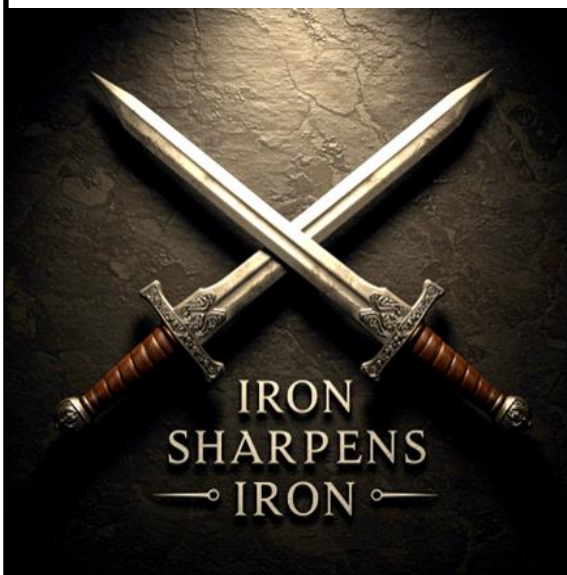

THANKSGIVING EVE FOOD DRIVE

As we gather in gratitude this season, the Human Care Board invites you to help fill the shelves at SnowCap, our local food bank. Together, we can make a real difference for families in need right here in our community.

Reusable grocery bags will be available in the Narthex from Sunday, November 2 through Sunday, November 23. Thanksgiving Eve Plate Offering: The Church Council has elected that this year's Thanksgiving Eve plate offering will be shared between the Benevolence Fund and the Outreach Board. This means that if you give a Thanksgiving Eve monetary donation—either in the plate or online—it will support both causes unless you specify otherwise on your check or envelope.

The Benevolence Fund, overseen by the Human Care Board, assists with financial needs within our congregation and among friends of our members. Meanwhile, the Outreach Board uses donations to buy Bibles, set up tables at community events, and share the Gospel in our community.

HELP IMPROVE OUR COMMUNITY ROOM SOUND ABSORBING PANELS: Can you help?

Our Community Room has become a wonderful hub for ministry — hosting Bible studies, Voters Assemblies, meals, receptions, and outreach events. However, as many have experienced, the echo in the room makes it difficult to hear clearly and carry on conversations. Voices seem to bounce around the walls, and for those with hearing difficulties or hearing aids, it can be nearly impossible to understand what's being said. This has made group discussions, prayer, and fellowship challenging at times.

To make this space more welcoming and effective for ministry, plans are underway to install sound-absorbing panels that will greatly improve voice clarity and reduce echo. The total cost for production and shipping is \$8,600, covering about 30% of the wall area — enough to make a noticeable and lasting difference.
