CHRISTIAN OBITUARY

ROBERT STANLEY REKDAHL

July 8, 1947 - June 8, 2024



Robert Stanley Rekdahl (Bob), son of Stanley William Rekdahl and Roberta F. Rekdahl (Sperry), was born in Portland, Oregon on July 8, 1947, and died on June 8, 2024, with his wife and family members at his side.

Robert Rekdahl was united in marriage with Deborah Linke on June 17, 1972, at St. John Lutheran Church in Portland. They lived in north Portland for 22 years then

moved to Troutdale in 1994 where he resided until his death. Their love for each other never faltered and they persevered through many health and life issues. Bob and Debbie soon became a dependable and steady team for the extended family. Bob died 9 days before their 52nd anniversary.

Bob was baptized at St. John Lutheran Church by Pastor Ty Miles on Easter Sunday, April 23, 2000, and reaffirmed his love for God at Ascension Lutheran Church on October 1, 2006. He was a member of Ascension at the time of his death.

Bob opened his own business in the 1970s as a gutter subcontractor. He was known by his customers as a guy who would give them an honest bid and an opinion of what could be done. He was fair, honest, and a good listener. People liked that and often referred him to their friends. He had the gutter business until 2016 when he retired.

Bob and Debbie bought a house in Seaside in 2000. The House quickly became a destination for family, friends, a few vacations, countless hours of maintenance and finally a sale in 2022 that helped support their retirement. They jumped at the opportunity to go to the Holy Land in 2007 and loved seeing the land where Jesus walked. They took hundreds of photos and reminisced often while looking through them how fortunate they were to go when they did.

Bob volunteered in many capacities at Ascension – property management, usher, Human Care, Helping Hands, My Father's House, Snowcap – mostly behind the scenes where he preferred to work.

He will always be remembered as a much-loved uncle to many nieces and nephews, a comforting listener to numerous relatives, a great brother, brother-in law, and a caring friend to many.

Preceding him in death are his parents, Stanley and Roberta Rekdahl-and many relatives.

He is survived by his loving wife, Debbie; his brother, David (Marci); David's son, Jess (Anita), their sons Tristan and Gaige; David's son Lucas, and daughter Murphy; brother-in-law, William (Michelle); sisters-in-law, Rebecca and Tamara (Gabriel); and many nieces and nephews.
