

Through My Window



Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth," (Acts 1:8, ESV).

Recent news stories have reported devastating storms across the Midwest, including tornadoes, flooding, and widespread power outages. I remember during my time in St. Louis, a windstorm brought down countless trees, leaving the area without electricity for five days. Even here in East County, powerful gusts from the Columbia River Gorge often knock out power as trees and branches fall on lines.

Our modern lives depend heavily on electricity. Beyond conveniences like the internet, refrigeration, and lighting, electricity can mean life or death, especially for those in critical care or the elderly in cold weather. Life as we know it is built around power.

In a similar way, our Christian lives are built around the power of the Holy Spirit. After rising from the dead, Jesus spent 40 days preparing His disciples for the mission ahead. He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that pointed to Him and the salvation He accomplished through the cross and empty tomb. But His continued bodily presence was not part of the plan. Instead, the Holy Spirit would come, bringing renewed power and energy to the disciples and their calling.

This same Holy Spirit empowers every believer today. with a singular mission: to point to Christ. To be a witness is to confess Jesus as Savior, and that confession is only possible through the Spirit. As St. Paul writes, "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except in the Holy Spirit," (1 Cor. 12:3). In our weakness, the Spirit supplies strength. As Jesus Himself says, "My power is made perfect in weakness," (2 Cor. 12:9).

The energy we need to live as witnesses for Christ comes from the Spirit, who calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies us through the Gospel. Apart from the Spirit, our faith is lifeless.

Consider the great salvation story. Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection show us God's love in human form. And to carry that mission forward, Jesus gave us the power of the Holy Spirit to sustain the Church through all time. The Spirit continually brings us God's grace, forgiveness, and salvation, always pointing us to Christ.

We are powered up and ready to go. And unlike the electricity we depend on, this power never goes out. No storm, tragedy, or tribulation can disrupt it. In fact, the more we are weakened by life, the more clearly God's power is revealed.

Incluso aquí en el este del condado, las fuertes ráfagas de viento de la garganta del río Columbia a menudo dejan sin electricidad a los árboles y ramas que caen sobre las líneas.

Nuestra vida moderna depende en gran medida de la electricidad. Más allá de comodidades como Internet. refrigeración e iluminación, la electricidad puede significar la vida o la muerte, especialmente para aquellos en cuidados intensivos o los ancianos en climas fríos. La vida, tal como la conocemos, se construye en torno al poder.

De manera similar, nuestras vidas cristianas se basan en el poder del Espíritu Santo. Después de resucitar de entre los muertos, Jesús pasó 40 días preparando a sus discípulos para la misión que les esperaba. Él abrió sus mentes para entender las Escrituras que señalaban a Él y la salvación que Él logró a través de la cruz y la tumba vacía. Pero su continua presencia corporal no era parte del plan. 



We hope you'll join us and invite a friend! Our next meeting will be June 28 in the Community Room.





Re-Vitality Assessment Results

In March and April, Ascension members and friends filled out a survey from Re:Vitality called the Congregational Assessment of Development and Decline Status (CADDS). The CADDS survey results give us a snapshot of our congregational health but is not a comprehensive evaluation. In simple terms, the survey helps answer the question, "Where are we really?" as a congregation. A visual curve, called the Vitality Arc, shows whether a church is growing, declining, or somewhere in between. Ascension's plot point on this curve gives us a reference point for planning. The Vitality Arc shows that we are at the top of the arc and slightly into Stasis. Each of the stages can be turned toward Prime by working on focus areas.





Below are 10 Factors of Vitality that affect our congregation's health, and they are shown as disabling factors, neutral factors, and enabling factors. Our survey results all showed enabling factors only, but some are stronger than others, with the longer lines representing stronger enabling factors. Our strongest factors are outreach and vision.


Factors of Vitality

Scale	Description
Adaptability	How willing we are to make necessary changes
Community	How willing we are to engage the community around us
Family	How well we minister to families and children
Hospitality	How welcoming and responsive we are to our visitors and guests
Inactives	How well we serve our inactive members
Incorporation	How well we help our members get involved in our ministries
Outreach	How effectively we reach out to people outside of the church
Unity	How well we get along and our overall morale
Viability	How confident we are about being able to continue our ministry
Vision	How strong our sense of our mission and purpose is
