Welcome to all who are attending our service today. We are glad you are with us! To all guests and visitors, we especially extend our hands of friendship. May God bless the worship time for each one of you. Please come again!

NURSERY AVAILABLE We have an unstaffed nursery for your convenience and privacy. The nursery has audio and video so you may hear and see the worship service while attending to your child.

Holy Communion is celebrated at the 8:30 service on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, and at the 11:00 service on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

For those wishing to commune at the Lord's Table with us today: The Lutheran practice of close Communion attempts to prevent a person from eating and drinking judgment on himself (1 Corinthians 11:23–30). Thus, attendance at the Lord's Supper implies a four-level commitment to Christ. We believe that communicants must: (1) be baptized Christians; (2) accept the real presence of Christ's body in the bread and His blood in the wine; (3) confess and repent of one's sins and trust that God offers complete forgiveness of those sins in this Sacrament; and (4) share oneness of faith, doctrine and practice among those who commune. Those wishing to commune with us today who have not done so previously, please see the pastor or an elder before the service begins. (Grape juice is available for those who do not drink alcohol, and gluten-free wafers are available upon request.)

Creemos que los comulgantes deben: (1) ser bautizados como cristianos; (2) aceptar la presencia real del cuerpo de Cristo en el pan y Su sangre en el vino; (3) confesar y arrepentirse de sus pecados y confiar en que Dios ofrece el perdón completo de esos pecados en este Sacramento; y (4) compartir la unidad de fe, doctrina y práctica entre los que comulgan. Aquellos que desean comulgan con nosotros hoy que no lo han hecho anteriormente, por favor vean al pastor o un anciano antes de que comience el servicio. (El jugo de uva está disponible para aquellos que no beben alcohol, y hostias libres de gluten están disponibles bajo petición.)

Theme: "Opened: The Gates of Righteousness"

As We Gather: "Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord" (Psalm 118:19). Today's psalm speaks of gates opening for the people of God to enter into His holy presence. These are not any old gates; these are the "gates of righteousness." As the outstretched arms and nailscarred hands of our Savior welcome us all to enter these gates, we walk by faith into the presence of the faithful Father who freely gives us His forgiveness. Palm Sunday is the "gate" of Holy Week. As we gather for worship, let us walk through this gate with Jesus, our King, remembering His suffering for our salvation, and receiving again the gifts of God that inspire in us our thanks and praise.

John 12:12-19 (ESV)

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter.

¹²The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written.

15"Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

¹⁶His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. ¹⁷The crowd that had been with Him when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised Him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign. ¹⁹So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him."

HOLY GOSPEL

Matthew 26 and 27 (ESV)

(The congregation reads the parts in bold)

- The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the Passion of Our Lord.
- Glory to You, O Lord.

JUDAS AGREES TO BETRAY JESUS (Mt 26:14-16, 21-25)

¹⁴Then one of the twelve, whose name was Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests ¹⁵and said, "What will you give me if I deliver Him over to you?" And they paid him thirty pieces of silver. ¹⁶And from that moment he sought an opportunity to betray Him.²¹And as they were eating, He said, "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray Me." ²²And they were very sorrowful and began to say to Him one after another.

"Is it I, Lord?"

²³He answered, "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with Me will betray Me. ²⁴The Son of Man goes as it is written of Him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born." ²⁵Judas, who would betray Him, answered,

"Is it I, Rabbi?"

He said to him, "You have said so."

JESUS' PREDICTION OF PETER'S DENIAL (Mt 26:31-35)

³¹Then Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of Me this night. For it is written, 'I will strike the Shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' ³²But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee." ³³Peter answered Him,

"Though they all fall away because of You, I will never fall away."

³⁴Jesus said to Him, "Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." ³⁵Peter said to Him,

"Even if I must die with You, I will not deny You!"

And all the disciples said the same.

JESUS PRAYS IN THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE (Mt 26:36-46)

³⁶Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and He said to His disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." ³⁷And taking with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, He began to be sorrowful and troubled. ³⁸Then He said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with Me." ³⁹And going a little farther He fell on His face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will."

⁴⁰And He came to the disciples and found them sleeping.

And He said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with Me one hour? ⁴¹Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." ⁴²Again, for the second time, He went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, Your will be done."

⁴³And again He came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy.

⁴⁴So, leaving them again, He went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again. ⁴⁵Then He came to the disciples and said to them, "Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. ⁴⁶Rise, let us be going; see, My betrayer is at hand."

JUDAS' BETRAYAL AND THE ARREST OF JESUS (Mt 26:47-56)

⁴⁷While He was still speaking, Judas came, one of the twelve, and with him a great crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the elders of the people. ⁴⁸Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "The one I will kiss is the man; seize Him." ⁴⁹And he came up to Jesus at once and said,

"Greetings, Rabbi!" And he kissed Him.

⁵⁰Jesus said to him, "Friend, do what you came to do."

Then they came up and laid hands on Jesus and seized Him.

⁵¹And behold, one of those who were with Jesus stretched out his hand and drew his sword and struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear. ⁵²Then Jesus said to him, "Put your sword back into its place. For all who take the sword will perish by the sword. ⁵³Do you think that I cannot appeal to My Father, and He will at once send Me more than twelve legions of angels? ⁵⁴But how then should the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must be so?" ⁵⁵At that hour Jesus said to the crowds, "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture Me? Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize Me. ⁵⁶But all this has taken place that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled."

Then all the disciples left Him and fled.

PETER'S DENIAL (Mt 26:69-75)

⁶⁹Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. And a servant girl came up to him and said, "You also were with Jesus the Galilean." ⁷⁰But he denied it before them all, saying,

"I do not know what you mean."

⁷¹And when he went out to the entrance, another servant girl saw him, and she said to the bystanders, "This man was with Jesus of Nazareth." ⁷²And again he denied it with an oath:

"I do not know the man."

After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter,
 "Certainly you too are one of them, for your accent betrays you."
 Then he began to invoke a curse on himself and to swear,

"I do not know the man."

And immediately the rooster crowed. ⁷⁵And Peter remembered the saying of Jesus, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." And he went out and wept bitterly.

JESUS BEFORE PILATE (Mt 27:11-17, 21-26)

¹¹Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You have said so." ¹²But when He was accused by the chief priests and elders, He gave no answer. ¹³Then Pilate said to Him, "Do You not hear how many things they testify against You?" ¹⁴But He gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, – so that the governor was greatly amazed. ¹⁵Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to release for the crowd any one prisoner whom they wanted. ¹⁶And they had then a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. ¹⁷So when they had gathered, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release for you: Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?" ²¹The governor again said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said,

"Barabbas."

²²Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said,

"Let Him be crucified!"

²³And he said, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they shouted all the more,

"Let Him be crucified!"

²⁴So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves." ²⁵And all the people answered,

"His blood be on us and on our children!"

²⁶Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered Him to be crucified.

THE SOLDIERS MOCK JESUS (Mt 27:27-31)

²⁷Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they gathered the whole battalion before Him. ²⁸And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him, ²⁹and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on His head and put a reed in His right hand. And kneeling before Him, they mocked Him, saying,

"Hail, King of the Jews!"

³⁰And they spit on Him and took the reed and struck Him on the head. ³¹And when they had mocked Him, they stripped Him of the robe and put His own clothes on Him and led Him away to crucify Him.

JESUS' CRUCIFIXION (Mt 27:32-44)

³²As they went out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. They compelled this man to carry His cross. ³³And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), ³⁴they offered Him wine to drink, mixed with gall, but when He

tasted it, He would not drink it. ³⁵And when they had crucified Him, they divided His garments among them by casting lots. ³⁶Then they sat down and kept watch over Him there. ³⁷And over His head they put the charge against Him, which read,

"This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."

³⁸Then two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and one on the left. ³⁹And those who passed by derided Him, wagging their heads ⁴⁰and saying,

"You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save Yourself! If You are the Son of God, come down from the cross."

⁴¹So also the chief priests, with the scribes and elders, mocked Him, saying,

⁴²"He saved others; He cannot save Himself. He is the King of Israel; let Him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in Him. ⁴³He trusts in God; let God deliver Him now, if He desires Him. For He said, 'I am the Son of God.'"

⁴⁴And the robbers who were crucified with Him also reviled Him in the same way.

THE DEATH OF JESUS (Mt 27:45-54)

⁴⁵Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. ⁴⁶And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" ⁴⁷And some of the bystanders, hearing it, said,

"This man is calling Elijah."

⁴⁸And one of them at once ran and took a sponge, filled it with sour wine, and put it on a reed and gave it to Him to drink. ⁴⁹But the others said,

"Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save Him."

⁵⁰And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up His spirit. ⁵¹And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split. ⁵²The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, ⁵³and coming out of the tombs after His resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. ⁵⁴When the centurion and those who were with Him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said,

"Truly this was the Son of God!"

JESUS' BURIAL (Mt 27:57-61)

⁵⁷When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. ⁵⁹And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud ⁶⁰and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had cut in the rock. And he rolled a great stone to the entrance of the tomb and went away. ⁶¹Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb.

PILATE POSTS A GUARD (Mt 27:62-66)

⁶²Next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate ⁶³and said, "Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while He was still alive, 'After three days I will rise.' ⁶⁴Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, lest His disciples go and steal Him away and tell the people,

'He has risen from the dead,' and the last fraud will be worse than the first." ⁶⁵Pilate said to them, "You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can." ⁶⁶So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.
